Week 3 – Spend, Share & Save

Pre-K – Grade 5 Education

April is National Financial Literacy Month, which is designed to create awareness about the importance of personal financial education. Last week we focused on credit.

This week our focus will be on spend, share, and save. Learning early on how to manage money is the goal! Spending is to be expected, so help your children understand the difference between instant gratification and delayed gratification. Have them make a list of the items they would like to spend their money on and then help decide which items will be used and enjoyed for the longest period of time. Saving money is also essential. Your child doesn't have to save a large portion of their money, but he or she should set aside something every time they receive money. Another great way to foster a healthy attitude towards money, is to encourage children to give to others. Teaching children early on about giving is just as important as teaching them good savings and spending habits. This week's activities will include flashcards, a spend, share, and save chart, and two worksheets.
